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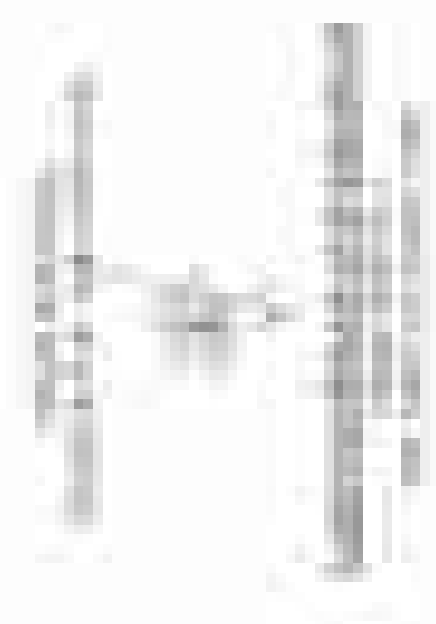
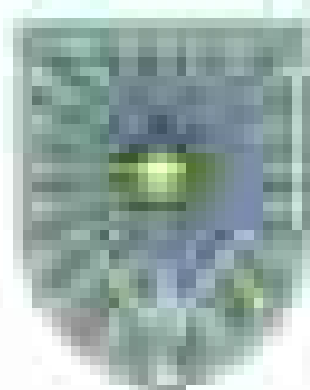


Figure 1: A small, stylized illustration of a person sitting on a chair, possibly a deity or a noble figure, with a small table or altar in front of them. The figure is wearing traditional robes and has a halo or a similar headpiece. The background is plain.	Figure 2: A small, stylized illustration of a person sitting on a chair, possibly a deity or a noble figure, with a small table or altar in front of them. The figure is wearing traditional robes and has a halo or a similar headpiece. The background is plain.

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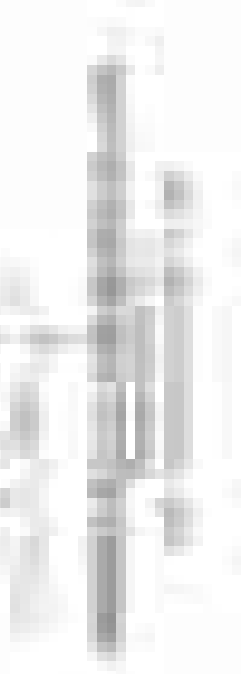


Figure 1: A person in traditional Chinese attire, possibly a scholar or official, standing and holding a long object, possibly a staff or a musical instrument.

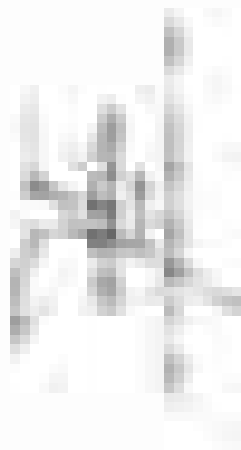
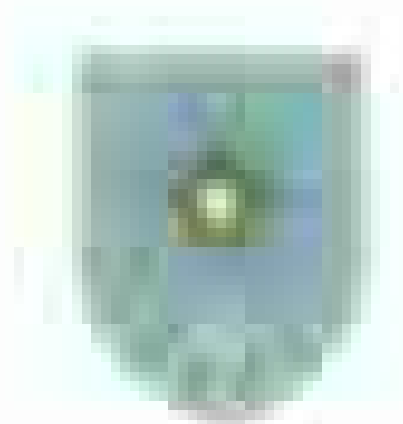


Figure 2: A person in traditional Chinese attire, possibly a scholar or official, standing and holding a long object, possibly a staff or a musical instrument.

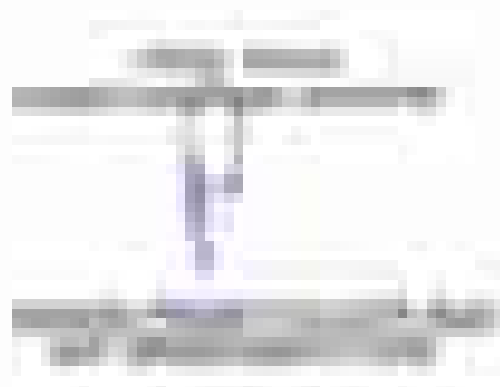


Figure 10-10: The Value of a Call Option

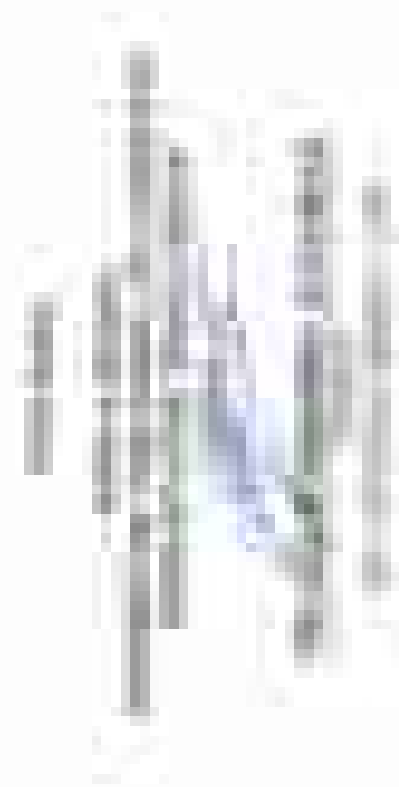
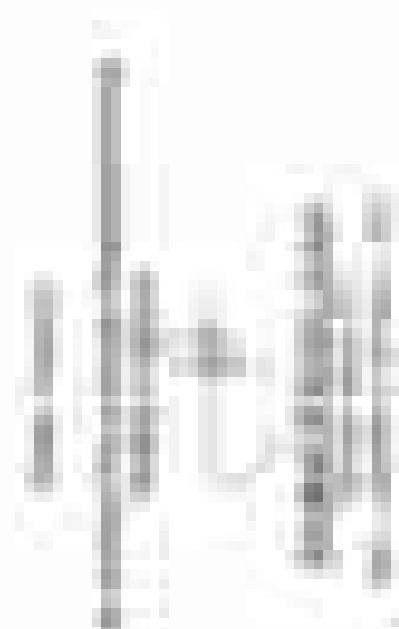
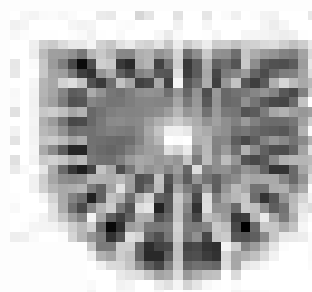


Figure 1: A person in a white lab coat standing next to a large piece of scientific equipment, possibly a microscope or a large test tube, in a laboratory setting.
